ENCOURAGING WORDS

Refocus: Over the last few weeks we have talked about refo-
cusing in regard to our marriages and raising our children.
Yet, there are many other areas in the home where we may
need to refocus as well. Not all of us may be raising kids, not
all of us may be married, but we all have a home. We are all
part of a family. Our other family members, whoever they
may be, deserve our love, attention, and focus as well. Be-
yond that, however, we also need to focus ourselves toward
opening our home to others. God wants His people to be
hospitable to others. Such is a qualification for an elder in the
Lord's church (1 Timothy 3:2), and like most of the other elder
qualifications it is nothing more than a goal that every Chris-
tian should have. Other passages that teach about this im-
portant, but overlooked characteristic are (Romans 12:13,
Hebrews 13:12, and 1 Peter 4:9). We often get so focused on
our own lives and wants that we forget the importance of
opening up our homes (and our lives) to those around us.
Let us refocus on hospitality and make our home a haven not
only for ourselves but whoever else may need it.
